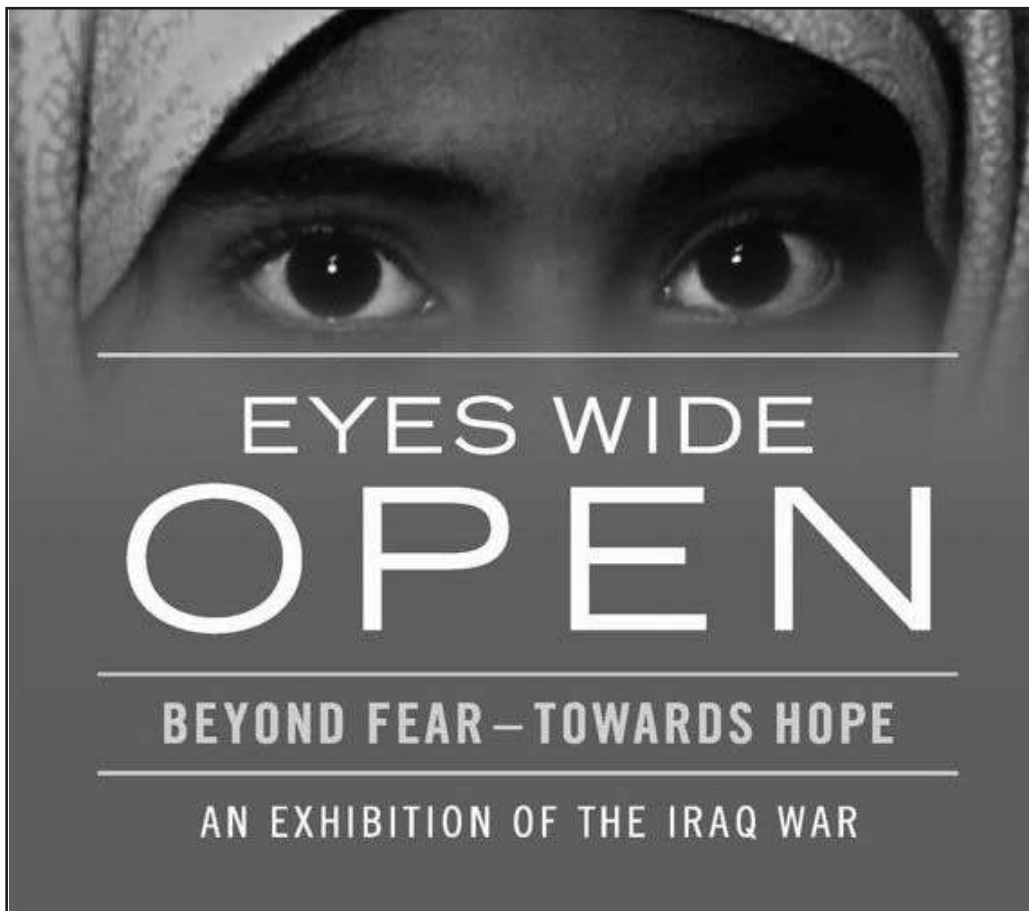


Eyes Wide Open is a space for

The centerpiece of the exhibit is a set of combat boots - one pair for every US soldier who has died in the conflict. Recently this number surpassed 1000.
